**2011 OPEN LECTURE Report** 

"Understanding Dissociative Symptoms of Children in Residential Facility"

## Speaker: Dr. F. W. Putnam

On Oct. 10<sup>th</sup>, 2011, we invited Dr. F. W. Putnam, the world authority on Child Abuse and Neglect, to our open lecture on "Understanding of Dissociative Symptoms of Children in Residential Facility".

Dr. Putnam presented evidences showing the effectiveness of childhood adversities maltreated experience upon the child's life. He also showed specific dissociative behaviors in children. The participants conceivably were calling up children they work with. The importance of early development and preventive support, such as early brain development and attachment was emphasized.

Furthermore, Dr. Putnam introduced a program which can be utilized for children in social care. It was a valuable time to understand and get a practical vision working with these children.

Dr. Putnam told us that children get better with support. His words gave courage to those who work with children especially regarding the increase of hard-to-intervene cases. **We're making DVD of this lecture!!** 

Two hundred and seventy people came to this lecture. For the first time, we prepared a second room with a live monitor. Some of you might have felt inconvenience. Thank you for your understanding.

## Report of The Fifth "Orange Ribbon TASUKI Relay for CANP"

On Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> we held The 5<sup>Th</sup> Orange Ribbon Tasuki Relay. Along with the usual Shonan course(50km) and Urban course(50km), we established Kamakura /Miura(KM) course(45km) this year. A total of 350 runners passed the orange Tasuki to the goal Yamashita Park! Runners of the KM course put their hands together to the Daibutu. People with sight disability joined us at Hiratsuka Stadium of Shonan course. As last year, Urban course started from Hachiko, the dog statute of Shibuya station. Mr. I noue, who stays the whole Urban course every year, had also ran through the course of Tasuki relay in Shiga prefecture(60km) the day before (\* ';)!!

The crowds were larger than last year. There were 3 booths supporting the revival from East Japan Earth Quake. A quilt designer have participated to create a "Praying Friendship Quilt" with messages for the children in the stricken area. This will continue next year adding more quilt to make a 16m Tasuki.

We ran with woolen Tasukies sent from the quake stricken area of I wate prefecture, and passed the Tasuki to Oyama city of Tochigi., Gifu and Shiga. We hope this movement will spread out. Thank you for your cooperation!
