FY2013 (April 1st, 13' - Mar 31st, 14') Training Schedule

We have sent out the bulletin with all the FY2013 (April 1st 2013-Mar 31st 2014) training programs listed to related organizations. You can also download the schedule from our homepage.

Based on the view of frontline workers, we are planning to hold twenty five training programs in FY2013. We will introduce four of our training programs:

Thematic Trainings

Every year, we open training programs with specific themes. This training is recommended to those who have at least three years of experience working with child abuse & neglect cases.

♪ 「Critical Phase of Children」【May 14th - 15th】 ♪ 「Family Support」【March 4th - 5th】

This program is set to consider what we can do to move towards a child protective and child rearing society. Lectures on bullying, sexual victimization, juvenile offender, and school-refusal will enable the participants to have a clearer vision of children living in current society.

This program is one of the most longstanding training. We will pick up issues such as the effect of parental divorce and issues at diverse support settings such as childcare facilities, children's guidance centers, and local authorities, along with a keynote lecture on "Transformation of Family-Image over time".

♪ 「Learning from Fatal Child Abuse Cases」【March 19th】

The lecture will focus on the measures and progress of "National Child Death Reviews" and "Serious Case Reviews". We are also planning to report post-review practice of various organizations.

Training Course for Health Supervisors working on Child Abuse and Neglect Cases【Aug 20th - 22th】

We are opening a new training program for health professionals. The program is expected to have lecture on "The impact of child abuse & neglect on physical and mental health" "Fatal cases" "Identifying child abuse & neglect cases" "Home visitation" and "Case review". This program will be an opportunity to reconsider the role of health professionals on child care support, the provision of child abuse & neglect and preventing such cases.

* "Multi-Disciplinary Training for University and Graduate Students (MDT)" and "Training Course for Medical Professionals in Children's Guidance Centers" are suspended as we considered the course has completed serving certain role.
